Our gardens are spread across two neighborhoods, an approximate 1.3 mile walk from Garden 1 to Garden 8. Feel free to walk, drive (parking should be plentiful) or enjoy the complimentary transportation which runs every 10-15 minutes.

Open Garden Day is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. A portion of the proceeds from this event go directly back into the neighborhoods, environmental education, and local schools which totaled \$9,000 last year.

1143 Sharon Rd : Fisher Park

Welcome to our 1955 Ranch style home with a large front yard with two paths which lead to the backyard. We purchased the house in 1995 for the large one-third acre lot. Enjoy the paths along the English garden with an arch trellis of Queen's Wreath and other plants and flowers that attract butterflies, bees, and hummingbirds.



Visitors can walk around the raised bends that were made for growing strawberries and other vegetables. Along the paths, you will see two 65 year-old naval orange trees that offer both shade and fruit.

Our love for our five grandchildren encouraged us to create a "playground" environment for them next to the children's playhouse that has now been converted into a chicken coop for our six hens. Visitors can walk past the chicken run to the aviary

which houses finches, parakeets, and button quails. The aviary adds a soothing environment to the backyard. One can also enjoy the small butterfly habitat/display. Each spring, to boost the population of Monarch butterflies we practice "capture rearing" which is the practice of collecting eggs and caterpillars. During this time the butterflies feed on native milkweed until the chrysalises process begins. When they emerge out of the chrysalis as a beautiful Monarch, the butterflies are released in our garden to return to lay their eggs and continue the process.

The Anderson Garden is an adventure that is sure to delight any visitor.



1222 W River Ln : Fisher Park

In Santa Ana, as Disneyland was taking shape in nearby Anaheim, we settled on West River Lane by the creek, our home for going-on 30 years.

Our sprawling backyard offers a retreat for weeding, blending

relaxation with productivity. The front yard's hydrangeas, and the magnificent magnolia in the back, frame our outdoor sanctuary, centered around a patio and fire pit.

Be sure to pop your head inside, where three foster bunnies add a unique charm to the family room, and who are prepared to greet visitors. This space nearly featured in "Austin Powers: International Man of Mystery" due to our vintage 1950s kitchen, though sadly it didn't make the final cut.



Each element of our home contributes to a narrative rich with memories, nature's tranquility, and a brush with Hollywood, embodying more than just a place to live but a story to tell.



944 W Buffalo Ave : West Floral Park

Welcome to the Moss Hose, a ranch style home built in 1959. We are the 2nd owners to steward this home, a time capsule lovingly cared for and preserved. Massive foliage was peeled back to expose more space and improvements were carefully made to look original.



Entering the side gate, you are greeted by "Walt, the Disney Tree", gardenias and a fountain at The Cottage, built in 1961. The breezeway is utilized as a gaming area that leads to the pool. Teri's Garden attracts hummingbirds and butterflies year round, and the decking that was added behind the pool is a work in progress.

Passing by the lounge, a firepit is discovered in the brick hardscape where we created an outdoor living/dining area surrounded by privet, roses, lilac,

sweet pea and lavender.

Through the Climbing Eden arch you will find 2 designated kitchen gardens, and then rounding the corner of the "Puppy Playpen" (enclosed in 2023) is Orchard Row (citrus originally planted by Betty Moss). The newly enclosed yard space is perfect for outdoor gatherings. We hope we created spaces to soak in the beauty of nature while enjoying the company of others. Our home is currently listed on the historic Registry and in process of completing the Mills Act.




2110 N Olive St : West Floral Park

Over the last 13 years we transformed the yard of our 1965 Ranch home into drought tolerant, low maintenance, wildlife friendly spaces. In front, native Woodland Strawberry thrives in the shade of a thornless Chilean mesquite tree. This amazing tree survived being blown over twice! New Zealand flax, blue fescue, and a shoestring acacia tree bring

texture, while Kangaroo paws and penstemon give spectacular seasonal color. Dymondia, blue pencil, and kalanchoe are hardy enough for the verge between the sidewalk and the street.


In back, we kept three citrus trees—navel and Valencia oranges and grapefruit—as the backbone of the garden. A volunteer group harvests over a ton of fruit each year for local food banks from these 60-year-old trees. We used the orange



Daniel Garcia of Root & Crown Landscape designed and installed the garden, patio, and fountain. We asked for a drought-tolerant, wildlife-friendly, dog-safe yard, and Daniel hit it out of the park! Plants to attract birds and insects include salvia "Amante" hummingbird sage, firecracker plant, coyote mint, pink muhly grass, and a Strawberry tree. Lily turf flourishes in the shade. Birds and bees love the shallow pools on top of the natural rock fountain, and we love the soothing sound.

2009 N Olive St: West Floral Park

Three years ago, we decided to turn our backyard into a Zen Garden. We designed it ourselves and selected all of the plants. We swapped out the thirsty flowers and grass for a simpler, more water-efficient design that still attracts birds, bees, and butterflies.



The central paver circle serves as the heart of the garden, providing a space for gathering and meditation. Rock and step pad paths run along the main compass point directions, adding both practicality and balance to the design. A tranquil pavilion offers a shaded conversation area that is flanked with two Japanese guardian lions who deflect negative energy.

Each quadrant of the garden holds its own meaning, with elements like water, wood, metal, and rocks

chosen to align with Feng Shui principles. Personal touches, like the four Icee Blue trees representing our children, the hand-carved lotus Juhla loveseats, and the vintage teak doors add warmth & significance.

Don't miss the rare Umbrella Pine, a sacred Japanese tree known for its symbolism to help with fertility and to guide departed souls to the afterlife.

Overall, our Zen Garden offers a serene and harmonious retreat for relaxation, contemplation, and connection with nature. Feel free to enjoy its peaceful ambiance!






936 W 21st St : West Floral Park

2135 N Rosewood Ave : West Floral Park

Lots of grass and rows of boxwood hedges--that was the nearly blank canvas of a yard we inherited when we bought this 1956 ranch house fifteen years ago. But we wanted something much more interesting. Today the space has been transformed into a more natural garden with drought tolerant



planting chosen for leaf shape and color, along with a variety of flowering plants that bloom at different times of the year. Yet some of the lawn was retained as a play area for our children and grandchildren to enjoy their outdoor games.

Because I'm a native Southern Californian, outdoor living is in my DNA. So, as you will see, the backyard is very private with an

outdoor family room resting on an added flagstone patio, a dining room in the coolest part of the yard, a vegetable garden with a variety of tomatoes, onions, herbs, and a very prolific artichoke, and a fire table to inspire after dark story telling. And then there are the decades-old orange trees. In the far corner is a Navel, great for eating, and two other trees are Valencias, known for their delicious juice.
